# 'Ducks' float to victory for the St. Tammany Humane Society

The second annual St. Tammany Humane Society's Duck Derby at Bogue Falaya Park was a quack-tastic success. Tension mounted as over 4,000 ducks jostled their way to the starting gate. The event raises money for the Society by having donators "adopt" a duck like betting on a horse at a horse race.

At the sound of the starting quack, the ducks bobbed and weaved for positioning. Thrusting a webbed foot forward to the finish line was Top Duck, owned by Ms. Ava Heigle, who won the \$1,000 purse. All the long hard hours of training paid off for this lucky ducky.

Owner Kaci Woodall's second-place duck netted her a \$1,000 gift certificate from Whole Foods. Diane Herrin's duck placed third, bringing home a fitness package from cousin Pelican Athletic Club. Beak to beak fourth, fifth, and sixth-place winners paddled furiously, bringing home Nonna Randazzo's Baskets for owners Debbie Brooks, Daniele Palen and Nanette Martin.

Top Duck was not the only winner.

The St. Tammany Humane Society also has a weekly summer camp for kids ages 8-13 and a program for seniors. Humans ages 65 years or older and animals 8 years or older can make the perfect match.

There is no adoption fee and the animal receives free vaccinations for the life of the pet and continued senior citizen discounts on all products and services.
